This scorecard reports key votes lawmakers cast on taxes and spending. A "+" vote denotes a pro-taxpayer position. The rating reflects the percentage of pro-taxpayer votes cast. Also reported is the cumulative score for each state legislator for years 1997-2003.

U.S. Senate Votes

- 1) Support Bush Tax Cuts (Roll Call 196)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to pass the Bush tax cuts which provide \$350 billion in tax relief for taxpayers and eliminate the double taxation of stock dividends.
- 2) Kill the Death Tax (Roll Call 62)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to permanently repeal the death tax.
- 3) Cut Taxes on Seniors (Roll Call 94)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to roll back President Clinton's 1993 tax increase on Social Security benefits for seniors.
- 4) Reject Government Price Controls (Roll Call 232)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this bogus scheme to reduce prescription drug prices by exporting American pharmaceuticals to Canada and subsequently buying them back at reduced prices.

- 5) Guarantee Overtime Pay for Low-Wage Workers (Roll Call 334)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to modernize federal labor regulations, guaranteeing overtime pay to 1.3 million more low-wage workers.
- 6) Improve Military Readiness (Roll Call 190)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to improve military readiness by exempting military training sites from environmental regulations.
- 7) Control Health Care Costs (Roll Call 264)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to help control health care costs by reducing frivolous lawsuits against health care providers.

- 8) Don't Ban SUVs (Roll Call 309)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject mandates to increase fuel economy standards for cars, trucks, and SUVs.
- 9) Expand Free Trade (Roll Call 319)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to approve the U.S.-Chile Free Trade Agreement, expanding export opportunities and creating new jobs for Americans.
- 10) Subject Government to Competition (Roll Call 408)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to support the President's goal of subjecting half of the federal government's commercial activities to private-sector bidding and competition, reducing costs and increasing government efficiency.

U.S. House of Representatives Votes

- 1) Support Bush Tax Cuts (Roll Call 225)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to pass the Bush tax cuts which provide \$350 billion in tax relief for taxpayers and eliminate the double taxation of stock dividends.
- 2) Kill the Death Tax (Roll Call 288)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to permanently repeal the death tax.
- 3) Provide Tax Relief for Families (Roll Call 274)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to increase the child care tax cut from \$600 to \$1,000, providing \$82 billion in tax relief for American families.
- 4) Reject Government Price Controls (Roll Call 445)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this bogus scheme to reduce prescription drug prices by exporting American pharmaceuticals to Canada and subsequently buying them back at reduced prices.

- 5) Provide School Choice (Roll Call 478)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to provide vouchers to needy families and children in our nation's capitol, allowing them to attend the school of their choice and to have a better education.
- 6) Guarantee Overtime Pay for Low-Wage Workers (Roll Call 531)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to modernize federal labor regulations, guaranteeing overtime pay to 1.3 million more low-wage workers.
- 7) Improve Health Care Access (Roll Call 328)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to enable individuals to make tax-free contributions to health savings accounts, increasing consumer choice and access to health care.
- 8) Control Health Care Costs (Roll Call 64)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to help control health care costs by reducing frivolous lawsuits against health care providers.

- 9) Expand Free Trade (Roll Call 436)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to approve the U.S.-Chile Free Trade Agreement, expanding export opportunities and creating new jobs for Americans.
- 10) Preserve our Forests (Roll Call 200)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to allow logging in overgrown forest areas, preventing forest fires and preserving our nation's forests.
- 11) Don't Ban SUVs (Roll Call 132)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject mandates to increase fuel economy standards for cars, trucks, and SUVs.
- 12) Cut Amtrak Subsidies (Roll Call 482)** The taxpayer friendly vote was to eliminate taxpayer subsidies to highly unprofitable Amtrak routes.

VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

MINNESOTA STATE SENATE

- NO NEW TAXES.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this Senate DFL proposal to raise taxes by \$1.3 billion. (passed 35-31)
- SUPPORT THE GOVERNOR'S BUDGET.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to support the Governor's plan to balance the budget without raising taxes. (failed 19-46)
- DON'T INCREASE CAR TAXES.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this measure to raise the gas tax and increase license tab fees. (passed 35-28)
- DON'T INCREASE STATE SUBSIDIES.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject increased state subsidies to cities. (failed 16-48)
- ELIMINATE PORK-BARREL PROJECTS.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject a \$393 million bonding proposal which provides millions of dollars for pet projects like the Guthrie Theater. (passed 35-31)
- OPPOSE SILLY REGULATIONS.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to oppose legislation to mandate that all lawn sprinklers sold must be designed to automatically shut off when it starts to rain. (passed 44-19)
- REJECT DISCRIMINATORY STATE POLICY.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this proposal to extend marriage benefits to unmarried state employees in same-sex relationships, while excluding state employees in opposite sex relationships (failed 24-42).
- NO PUBLIC FUNDS FOR POLITICAL PURPOSES.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to prohibit school districts from using taxpayer dollars to campaign in favor of levy referendums. (failed 30-33)
- OUTSOURCE STATE JOBS.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to allow the state to outsource some jobs to the private sector to increase efficiency. (failed 28-34)
- REPEAL THE PROFILE OF LEARNING.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to repeal the Profile of Learning, which wasted millions of tax dollars on bureaucracy while dumbing down our children. (passed 64-3)
- REJECT RATIONED HEALTH CARE.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this proposal for a rationed health care plan, which puts patient treatment decisions in the hands of state bureaucrats, not doctors. (passed 36-28)
- REFORM THE LEGAL SYSTEM.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reform the legal system by requiring that a defendant in a lawsuit must be more than 50% at fault before it can be held liable for 100% of the damages. (passed 43-22)

MINNESOTA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

- NO NEW TAXES.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to support the Omnibus Tax Bill, which balances the state budget without raising taxes. (passed 70-63)
- HOLD THE LINE ON GOVERNMENT SPENDING.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to support the Phase 1 budget bill which cut nearly \$500 million in spending from the 2003 budget. (passed 77-50)
- DON'T INCREASE CAR TAXES.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this measure to raise the gas tax and increase license tab fees. (failed 53-80)
- DON'T INCREASE STATE SUBSIDIES.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject increased state subsidies to cities. (failed 62-71)
- OPPOSE SILLY REGULATIONS.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this proposal to ban all dishwasher detergent containing any phosphorous (failed 49-84)
- SAY NO TO GOVERNMENT-RUN CASINO.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this proposal to build a government-chartered casino to fund pork barrel spending. (passed 71-60)
- NO PUBLIC FUNDS FOR POLITICAL PURPOSES.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to prohibit school districts from using taxpayer dollars to campaign in favor of levy referendums. (passed 90-41)
- LIMIT STATE SPENDING ON ART.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to support this legislation which caps the amount of state building costs that can be spent on commissioned art installations. (passed 81-51)
- REDUCE SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION COSTS.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this attempt to prevent school districts from hiring non-union labor and reduce costs for school construction projects. (failed 66-66)
- SUPPORT "FAMILY CAP" ON WELFARE PAYMENTS.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reject this attempt to kill a proposal to curtail increased welfare payments to families who have additional children. (failed 53-79)
- REPEAL THE PROFILE OF LEARNING.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to repeal the Profile of Learning, which has wasted millions of tax dollars on bureaucracy while dumbing down our children. (passed 125-9)
- REFORM THE LEGAL SYSTEM.** The taxpayer friendly vote was to reform the legal system by requiring that a defendant in a lawsuit must be more than 50% at fault before it can be held liable for 100% of the damages. (passed 80-51)
